The Green Meadows Conference announced that they had extended Paulding's invitation to join the conference as a member of the league. The invitation came just over a month after the league voted to remove Holgate from the conference. Holgate canceled his 11-man football season just over a month before the first game of the 2019 football season, leaving several member schools scrambling to find games to complete their schedules. Holgate has since accepted membership of the Buckeye Border Conference on all sports except football, where they joined the North 8 Football Conference. The league's executive board met on Thursday, February 20 to discuss the future of the GMC. At that meeting, they decided to invite Polding, who then gave a written response by accepting the invitation. The Paulding Board of Education must vote on this measure before the Panthers officially become members of the GMC. There is a special meeting of the Board of Education scheduled for Wednesday, February 26 to award applications for a new press box/softball field project. It is unclear whether the Board of Education will vote on the new conference measure at the time, or wait until the next scheduled meeting on March 17. A meeting between Poldaiing's sports department and the Green Meadows Conference Recruitment Committee is scheduled for Friday, February 28. Polding was a member of the Green Meadows Conference charter when the league formed in 1962. Paulding then left the league for the Northwestern Conference in 1974, where it remained ever since. All eight member schools are located in one of four counties: Henry County, Defiance County, Polding County, or Williams County. The source of history: The Green Meadows Conference was formed as a sports conference in 1962. The charter members of the conference were Ayersville, Fairview, Hicksville, Polding and Jewell (now Tinora). In 1966, Blue Creek, of Polding County and now part of the Wayne Trace School District, joined the conference. Then, in 1967, Oakwood joined. The conference remained untouched until 1972, when the consolidation of districts in Polding County triggered some changes in the composition of some member schools. Blue Creek became part of the new Wayne Trace School District, along with Grover Hill and Payne. Oakwood became part of the Paulding exempted school system. Antwerp and Holgate also joined the league, making eight members: Antwerp, Ayersville, Hicksville, Holgate, Fairview, Polding, Tinora, and Wayne Trace. In 1974, Poldin left the GMC to join the Northwest Conference. They were replaced by Edgerton. Membership remained unchanged until the 2019-20 school year. In February 2020, it was announced that Holgate Buckeye Border Conference as a member for every sport except football that will take part in the North 8 Football Conference. Holgate announced at the end of 2019 that they were switching to eight-person football because of the low numbers that forced the rest of the schools at the Green Meadows conference to vote for their exit from the GMC due to scheduling problems. The Tigers are expected to join the BBC in autumn 2021 or 2022. With Holgate's departure, the GMC decided to extend the invitation to the former Paulding member in February 2020, which was accepted shortly thereafter. Poldin, who has been a member of the Northwest Conference since leaving the GMC in 1974, is expected to return after the 2020-21 school year. Ayersville has traditionally been a football power at the conference. They won 10 consecutive conference titles between 1985 and 1994. Fairview was a similar power in girls' basketball, having repeatedly gone to the state tournament in the 1990s and winning the OHSAA Division III championship in 1989. Holgate won the state junior basketball championship in Division IV in 2004. Wayne Trace won the Division III basketball title in 1991 and played in The Final 4 in 1988, 2001, 2008 and 2015. They have won the conference title more than 20 times. The cross-country girls of Tinora consistently won the conference title in the 1990s and early 2000s. In 2013, Wayne Trace recently finished second in State in Football. In 2018, Edgerton won the GMC conference and reached the semifinals in football. Antwerp won the state volleyball championship in 1992, and won the volleyball title for the past two years and were the district champions. In addition, Wayne Trace and Fairview have been at the top of the cross-country conference for the past few years. The Tinora Boys basketball team recently captured the state's second-place trophy in Division III in the 2008-09 season. Tinora's baseball team recently made the state finals four years in a row with a state championship victory in 2014. Members of the Green Meadows School Conference.
